OUTCOMES OF THE BLUEPRINT:

PROGRAMMATIC AND POLICY CHANGE

HACC was created in 1943 and for many years built, owned and managed only traditional public housing. Faced with distressed Public Housing and ever-decreasing federal funding, HACC began redevelopment of its largest public housing communities in the 1990s using multiple mixed financing methods including Low Income Housing Tax Credits, to create new mixed-income communities. In 2010, HACC became one of only 39 Public Housing Authorities in the country to be designated as a Moving to Work (MTW) Agency. Today, HACC has extensive development and management experience having developed over \$100 million dollars of the new affordable housing through mixed financing methods.
